“ *To the Family of Mary Beth:*

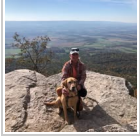
I was a friend of your Mother/Grandmother in Redwood Falls high school. I am so very sorry that we didn't know that she had passed until this moment in time - 7/10/19.
